Simile

Compares 2 very different things using "like" or "as"



"The pumpkin pie was as sweet as candy"

Metaphor

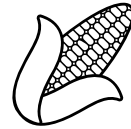
Compares 2 very different things without "like" or "as"



"The hot cocoa was a warm hug on a cool day."

Personification

Describes objects as having human abilities or traits



"The cornstalks whispered in the breeze."
